<p><u>Historical Fiction</u> Pretend you are a reporter from the time period in your book. Write a newspaper article about the major event happening in the story you are reading.</p>	<p><u>Read an Autobiography</u> Write a letter to the subject of your autobiography.</p> <p>Remember to use the letter format.</p>	<p><u>Read a Nonfiction Book</u> Create a graph or chart for the information you are reading. Be sure to include details from the text.</p>	<p><u>Read a Nonfiction book</u> Select 3 challenging words. Define the meaning, provide synonyms and antonyms and an image.</p>
<p><u>Read a Mystery Novel</u> Pretend you are the detective from your story. Write a journal entry from their point of view about the case he/she is solving.</p>	<p><u>Literature Chain</u> Use a chain to summarize the chapters, sequence story events, or review the story elements.</p>	<p><u>Finish the Novel</u> After reading your novel, you are going to add a new ending on to the book. Show the head of the person at the top. On the inside, note important events in the person's life.</p>
